

For more information regarding sacraments, please contact the parish office.

- **Anointing of the Sick** Notify the parish office if you or a family member is hospitalized and/or in need of Anointing of the Sick.
- **Baptism** Children under 7 years old: Baptisms are normally scheduled for any Saturday or Sunday during or immediately following Mass. Baptism during daily Mass is also possible. Scheduling depends on the availability of the pastor or deacons.

Baptisms occur only after completion of the Baptismal Preparation Program. To have a child baptized, parents must be members of the parish, should be active Mass attendees, and have completed the Baptismal Prep Program. Contact the parish office to schedule the class and/or baptism.

The Baptism Preparation Program consists of a home visit, if possible, and an evening preparation class held on the second Monday of the month from 7:00pm to 8:00pm in the Sahlfeld Room. You MUST register in advance before attending a Baptism Prep Class. Expectant parents are encouraged to complete the program prior to the birth of their child. There is no cost involved. If this date each month is not possible, contact the parish office for another option.

Adults wishing to be baptized must complete the RCIA program and are baptized during the Easter Vigil Mass.

Confirmation - Confirmation for eighth-grade students is held every year in conjunction with St. Aloysius. Location of the Confirmation Mass alternates between the two parishes. Preparation takes place during parish religious education classes at Queen of Peace and St. Aloysius, at Queen of Peace School, and at St. Joseph Consolidated School.

Adults who would like to be Confirmed do so through the RCIA program and will be Confirmed during the Easter Vigil Mass.

Eucharist - For Liturgy of the Eucharist times, see **Mass Schedule**, **page 3**. Lay ministers serve the shut-ins by bringing Communion to their home on a weekly basis. Contact the parish office to place someone on our homebound list.

Our second graders and PREP students make their First Communion in the weeks following Easter. Adults wishing to receive their first Communion do so at the Easter Vigil after completing the RCIA program.

Marriage - Couples contemplating marriage should call the parish office for an appointment with the pastor before setting a marriage date. Six months preparation is required. Marriages are not scheduled during Lent.

Reconciliation - Wednesday 7:30-8:45pm or by appointment - contact the parish office. Check the bulletin or website for additional opportunities throughout the year.

Liturgical Ministries

Minister schedules are assigned by the parish office. If you are interested in serving one of these ministries, please contact the parish office or fill out a Ministry Request Form found in the back of church or online, and return it to the parish office or drop it in the Sunday collection.

Altar Servers - Anyone who has received their First Communion is invited to become an Altar Server. Duties include carrying the cross, holding books for the priest celebrant when he is not at the altar, carrying the incense and censer, presenting the bread, wine, and water to the priest during the preparation of the gifts or assisting him when he receives the gifts from the people, washing the hands of the priest, and assisting the priest celebrant and deacon as necessary.

Servers should be mature enough to understand their responsibilities and to carry them out well and with appropriate reverence.

Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion - This is a lay person who has received the Sacrament of Confirmation that serves the Church by assisting the clergy in distributing the Holy Eucharist (the Body & Blood of Jesus Christ) to the believers.

A minister of Holy Communion should show the greatest reverence for the Most Holy Eucharist by their demeanor, their attire, and the manner in which they handle the consecrated bread or wine.

Lectors - Proclaiming the Word of God at Mass is more than simply reading out loud into a microphone. Mother Church teaches us that Christ is truly present in the proclamation of the Word. Therefore, the lector is charged with proclaiming the Sacred Scriptures in a way that makes it intelligible and spiritual to his or her brothers and sisters in the congregation.

A lector should be someone who has a gift for public speaking, who can deliver the message with clarity and confidence, and who has a deep respect for the Word of God. They should practice their assigned readings and meditate upon them before their assigned Mass.

Music Ministry - The choir and the guitar group are an integral part of parish worship. While they mostly involve people who sing, they also involve people who play instruments and have other talents as well. The groups are open to anyone who is interested in joining. One does not have to be a professional singer or a soloist to take part. One does have to be able to attend rehearsals and have the desire to praise God and learn the music.

Choir - Our choir leads the music at our 11:00 AM Mass on Sundays. Practice is held in the church at 10:30 AM. Anyone interested in joining should contact Choir Director Becky Sunderhaus, (513)738-1205, or the parish office.

Funeral Choir - The Funeral Choir ministers to the bereaved by providing music during the funeral Mass. Anyone interested in joining should contact Kevin Hoffman, Funeral Choir Coordinator & Pianist, at *khoffman@qphamilton.org*, Becky Sunderhaus, Choir Director, or the parish office.

Guitar Group - The guitar group is responsible for leading worship at our 3:30 Mass on Saturday. Practice is on Thursday evenings in the church. Anyone interested in joining this group can e-mail Connie Ehrnschwender at *cehrnschwender@gmail.com* or contact the parish office.

Sacristans - A sacristan is a member of our parish who arrives early to make the necessary preparations for Mass. Some of their duties include ensuring proper readings and announcements are in the correct location, setting out vessels for Communion distribution, preparing the gifts of bread and wine, washing the vessels after Mass, and making sure everything is in its place.

Ushers - An usher's role is to greet parishioners and guests as they enter our church, check-in scheduled liturgical ministers as they arrive and find substitutes as needed, answer any questions, aid parishioners or guests as needed, take up collections, count attendance, find persons to take up the gifts, and pass out bulletins after Mass.

Parish Information

- **Bereavement Committee** Members meet with bereaved parish families to help plan the Mass for the deceased and a luncheon on the day of the funeral. New members are always welcome. Contact the parish office for more details.
- **Bible Study** Ongoing studies. Call Deacon Mike at (513)319-1832 or see the parish website or bulletin for current and upcoming topics and information. Bible Study is held weekly on Tuesday evenings 7:00pm-8:30pm and repeated on Thursday mornings 9:00am-10:40am in St. Isidore Hall.
- Bingo Queen of Peace Parish's Bingo is held weekly on Thursday evenings in the Parish Hall. Bingo revenue provides a supplement to tuition costs in the school budget. All parents with children enrolled in the parish school (kindergarten-grade 8) are scheduled to work on one of our bingo teams. Workers are asked to report to their team captain by 6:00pm in the Parish Hall. Workers are expected to trade assignments if they are not able to work when they are scheduled. For assistance, contact team captains listed on the workers' schedule. For information, contact the parish office.
- **Blood Bank** The Queen of Peace Blood Bank is a service for our entire parish membership, their families, and their in-laws. The Blood Bank is in existence for and supported by parish members who donate blood throughout the year. New donors are always needed. Anyone requiring blood for any reason: illness, surgery, or accident is eligible at no charge. If you have a need for blood, wish to donate, or would like more information, contact our parish coordinator, Laura Herold, at (513)894-2462.
- Building & Grounds Committee This committee provides oversight and advises the pastor and Parish Council regarding the parish building and ground's maintenance needs and issues. Qualifications for membership include, but are not limited to, the following: members of Queen of Peace Parish; people experienced in the building or maintenance trades; and people who have demonstrated a willingness to work together as a team with the parish administrators responsible for the parish buildings and grounds. The Building & Grounds Committee meets on the second Wednesday of each month at 6:00pm in Urbain Hall.

If a parishioner chooses to contribute electronically, we ask that you continue to drop your empty envelope in the basket and check the "Electronic Giving" box. This will not only assist us in our accounting, but also help us keep our parishioner list accurate. Education Commission - This commission is an advisory board that helps to establish policies for all religious educational programs of the parish. The commission needs to have members who are concerned about the religious educational needs of the whole parish. They must be willing to focus on policy as a way to set a direction for the parish's religious educational endeavors and not as an attempt to do the administration. They must be willing to be open to the views of others on the commission and be willing to assert their own viewpoint. The commission needs to have members that reflect a wide range of concerns and interests in our parish including PREP, adult education, youth ministry, and our parish school.

Commission members must be willing to serve a three-year term which involves being present, participating in the commission's meetings, and doing any necessary preparation. Education Commission meets on the first Thursday of each month at 6:00pm in Urbain Hall. Salaried employees of the parish educational system are not eligible for membership.

Holy Hour - Every Tuesday & Friday at 3:00pm, The Apostolate for the Dying meets in church to pray the Chaplet of Divine Mercy as close as possible to the 3 o'clock Hour of Mercy for those who are sick or dying. All are welcome to join in this beautiful work of mercy. The Apostolate's members are also willing to visit the bedside of anyone who is in need of prayer at the request of the family. If you know of anyone who needs our prayers please contact Barb Huber or the parish office.

Mass Intentions - The parish accepts Mass Offerings to remember a particular intention. The most common intention is for the deceased. The parish can accept only the number of intentions that can be fulfilled in a year. The stipend is \$5.00 per Mass. Masses that cannot be fulfilled at Queen of Peace will be sent to the Archdiocese. If available, date preferences will be accommodated. (The Sunday 11:00am Mass is always offered for the Parish and People of Queen of Peace and certain feasts throughout the year are reserved to remember the faithful entrusted to the pastor's care.) Mass offerings may be brought to the parish office during regular hours or put in the collection basket in a separate envelope. The intentions will be listed in the weekly bulletin.

Due to our limited Mass schedule and overwhelming number of requests, we ask that no intention is offered more than once per month per person.

Memorial Bricks - The landscaped area around the Holy Family statue has been made into a Thanksgiving & Memorial Garden for the parish. If interested in purchasing a memorial brick to be placed in the garden, fill out a request form to indicate the inscription to be engraved and return to the parish office along with the \$75 fee. Forms can be obtained at the parish office, in the back of church, or on our website.

Men's Group - Formed in 2015, the Queen of Peace Men's Group, dedicated to Mary, under the patronage of St. Joseph, are called to pray, to lead, and to serve. They routinely share their time and collective and individual talents within the parish and the broader community.

These men meet every Wednesday evening from 7:30 until 8:30 PM in St. Isidore Hall for an hour of prayer and reflection centered on the readings of the upcoming Sunday as well as good fellowship. Currently made up of over twenty men, as you might expect, work, family, and personal needs result in only a portion the group meeting on any one day. Over time, however, the men have been very faithful and continue the call. All men of the parish, both young and old, are always invited to join. Monthly Newsletter "Queen's Messenger" - The Queen's Messenger is a monthly newsletter mailed to all registered parishioners from September through June. Parishioners are welcome to submit articles, stories, and information about parish or community events, awards received, special achievements, celebrations, etc. Articles may be submitted handwritten or typed to the parish office. Email submissions should be sent to parishoffice@qpchurch.org noting "Newsletter" as the subject. The article deadline is the 10th day of the previous month unless otherwise noted in the weekly bulletin.

Online Giving - Through WeShare, you can make your weekly contributions to Queen of Peace via automatic payment from your checking/savings account or credit card/debit card. WeShare offers a secure way for you to send and for our parish to receive your contributions. Automatic electronic contributions greatly help our parish to meet our financial needs by providing a predictable cash flow throughout the year. There is no fee to you, the parishioner, associated with the use of WeShare. To sign up, visit our website and navigate to Online & Planned Giving under the Information tab for step-by-step instructions or to download an online giving form. You can also fill out a form found in the back of church and return to the office or drop in the Sunday collection.

Parish Pastoral Council - The Queen of Peace Parish Pastoral Council advises the pastor on all parish matters. The council is not the decision-maker for the parish - that responsibility belongs to the pastor. The council is a representative body in the decision-making process in matters of policy or major administrative initiatives affecting the parish community. It is the responsibility of the council to represent to the pastor evaluations of the services and policies which affect the parish community and to make recommendations for the improvement of the quality of parish life and the effectiveness of the parish services and policies. Members must regularly attend council meetings (held the second Thursday of the month at 6:00pm in Urbain Hall) and perform the work of the council. Any parishioner wishing to address Parish Council at a meeting should contact the president prior to the meeting.

Members must be willing to serve as council officers and/or serve on a parish committee. Members must be willing to respect the confidentiality of matters discussed. Each elected member serves a term of three years.

Parish Religious Education Program (PREP) - PREP classes meet on Sunday mornings from 9:15am-10:45am from September through April. Our aim is to encourage a living faith by providing a formal and systematic instruction program for students in kindergarten through grade 8 who attend public schools. PREP aids parents, the first catechist of the faith, in deepening the faith commitment of their children through a greater understanding and knowledge of the person of Christ as well as the implications of the Gospel for their lives. PREP provides the first steps in a lifelong process of faith formation. Instruction will include detailed information and formation on the topics of: what we believe and why, the meaning and function of our forms of worship and prayer, the Mass, the Sacraments and preparation for them, our Church and its history, morality, and preparation of the Christian to live in the community and to participate actively in the life and mission of the Church. Our program will cooperate with parents to supplement, complement, and reinforce the effort and responsibility of the parents to bring up their children in the Faith. - **Church Vestibule (Posting Items)** Only parish-sponsored activities or information about certain other sacred events should appear in the church vestibule. Anyone who wishes to post information is requested to bring item(s) to the parish office for approval. Articles that have not been approved by the pastor will be removed.
- **Parish Hall and St. Isidore Use and Guidelines** Please contact the parish office for information on using these facilities. Necessary forms are available at the parish office and on our website. Facility rentals are available to <u>current parishioners only</u>.
- Parish Building Facilities Scheduling Any parish group who needs to schedule a facility must do so through the parish office. If more than one date is requested, the dates must be submitted either via e-mail, fax, or brought into the office. The group representative must pick up the building key in the parish office (during office hours) before the event and return it the following parish business day. If the function is a fundraiser, paperwork must be filled out at the parish office.
- VIRTUS Training/Background check As required by the Archdiocese of Cincinnati, all volunteers and employees 18 years or older must register and attend a VIRTUS: Protecting God's Children Awareness Session (lasting approximately 3 hours) and successfully complete a background check through SELECTION.com before their involvement in school/parish programs involving children. How to register for a VIRTUS training session: Visit virtusonline.org, click on First-Time Registrant, and follow the prompts to select a session time and location. All participants must pre-register before attending any VIRTUS session. Walk-ins are not permitted.

Completing a Background Check: All background checks for volunteers will be done online through SELECTION.com which is accessible through your VIRTUS Account. Log onto virtusonline.org and go to the toolbox tab. Click on SELECTION.com. There will be a one-time \$25 charge for this background check. It can take at least three weeks+ for this process to be completed.
